15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. A new section of the Public School Code is
17	enacted to read:
18	"[NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
19	"Family Involvement Act"."
20	Section 2. A new section of the Public School Code is
21	enacted to read:
22	"[NEW MATERIAL] LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
23	A. The legislature finds that the involvement and
24	support of families in the education of their children is an
25	integral part of improving academic achievement and that

properly constructed family involvement programs can play an important and effective role in the participation of families in their children's schools and in improving children's learning.

- B. The purpose of the Family Involvement Act is to ensure that family involvement programs are properly designed and implemented and to provide a focus and structure for these programs based on prior experience and research while maintaining sufficient local flexibility to design a program that best meets the needs of the local community. The goals of these programs are to:
- (1) engage families from diverse cultures positively in their children's education by:
- (a) building effective and consistent methods of home-school communications;
- (b) supporting families in developing skills that enhance their children's academic efforts and their development as responsible members of society; and
- (c) helping professionals learn to work comfortably with diverse families and to view these families as valuable sources of information about their children;
- (2) inform families that they can directly affect the success of their children's learning, offer families various techniques and strategies to improve their children's academic success or assist their children in learning at home, if they desire; and

1	(3) integrate family involvement programs,							
2	including compliance with the provisions of the Family							
3	Involvement Act, into a school's master plan for academic							
4	accountability."							
5	Section 3. A new section of the Public School Code is							
6	enacted to read:							
7	"[NEW MATERIAL] FAMILY INVOLVEMENT COUNCIL							
8	A. The "family involvement council" is created as an							
9	advisory council to the department of education.							
10	B. The council shall consist of nine members							
11	appointed by the state superintendent for staggered three-year							
12	terms as follows:							
13	(1) one representative of a statewide parent-							
14	teacher organization;							
15	(2) two parents or guardians of pupils enrolled							
16	in a public school;							
17	(3) two public school teachers;							
18	(4) one public school administrator;							
19	(5) one local school board member;							
20	(6) one representative of the business							
21	community; and							
22	(7) one department of education employee, who							
23	shall be the chairman of the council.							
24	C. The council shall:							
25	(1) develop an instrument or process to							
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1	evaluate family involvement programs developed by local school						
2	boards;						
3	(2) make recommendations to the department of						
4	education about family involvement programs that are effective;						
5	(3) make recommendations to the department						
6	about training programs for local school boards and school						
7	staff;						
8	(4) make recommendations to the department						
9	about facilitating coordination among school officials, parents						
10	and families, educators and community leaders; and						
11	(5) make recommendations to the department						
12	about the coordination of department services and services of						
13	other state agencies.						
14	D. Members of the council who are not state						
15	employees may receive per diem and travel expenses pursuant to						
16	the Per Diem and Mileage Act."						
17	Section 4. A new section of the Public School Code is						
18	enacted to read:						
19	"[NEW MATERIAL] FAMILY INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM						
20	A. Each local school board shall, in conjunction						
21	with parents, teachers, administrators and community leaders,						
22	establish a family involvement program for each school in the						
23	school district. The local school board shall:						
24	(1) ensure that parents and families						
25	participate in the planning, design, implementation and						

1	evaluation of the family involvement program; and				
2	(2) provide for regular and periodic programs				
3	throughout the school year that offer learning opportunities for				
4	both families and school personnel in areas such as:				
5	(a) the ability of families to directly				
6	affect the success of a child's learning through the support				
7	given at home and at school;				
8	(b) home activities, strategies and				
9	materials that can be used to assist and enhance the learning of				
10	children at home and at school;				
11	(c) the developmental needs of children,				
12	positive guidance techniques and ways for parents and teachers				
13	to build healthy relationships with children; and				
14	(d) the ability of families and schools				
15	to develop consistent and effective communications concerning				
16	the progress of the children in school and concerning school				
17	programs;				
18	(3) prepare an annual statement identifying				
19	specific objectives of the program; and				
20	(4) conduct an annual review and assessment of				
21	the program's progress in meeting its objectives, which shall be				
22	made available to parents.				
23	B. A family involvement program may include the				
24	following:				
25	(1) a plan to encourage participation by				

families from diverse cultures;

- (2) a program that builds on parenting strengths, helps families develop skills they desire and facilitates networks to support families in effectively nurturing their children;
- (3) a communication element that provides effective two-way communication practices to reach families, both individually and collectively, to ensure that families and school staff communicate back and forth about their children;
- (4) a home learning element that provides for families and staff to work together in developing learning goals and offers opportunities for learning activities at home and in the community;
- (5) a volunteer element that recruits and organizes volunteer participation from families and the community at large;
- (6) a governance and advocacy element that provides a democratic governance structure that ensures that parents are partners in policy making about school programs and that family representatives are elected to act as advocates or decision makers for other parents and families; and
- (7) a community outreach element that establishes partnerships with individuals and organizations in the community.
  - (8) a plan to encourage parents to visit
