[any felony] a first degree or other dangerous felony, an offense termed felony murder. The mental state required for felony murder is the mental state required for the predicate felony or attempted felony; or

(3) by any act greatly dangerous to the lives of others, indicating a depraved mind regardless of human life, an offense termed depraved mind murder. The mental state required for depraved mind murder is knowledge that the act creates a substantial risk of death or great bodily harm to two or more people. Knowledge for purposes of depraved mind murder may be established by circumstantial evidence and may not be negated by evidence of voluntary intoxication.

Whoever commits murder in the first degree is guilty of a capital felony.

B. Unless he is acting [upon sufficient provocation, upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion] in circumstances that would elevate his offense to first degree murder or reduce it to manslaughter, a person who kills another human being without lawful justification or excuse commits murder in the second degree. [if in performing the acts which cause the death he knows that such acts create a strong probability of death or great bodily harm to that individual or another] The mental state required for second degree murder is general criminal intent to commit the act that causes the death.

Murder in the second degree is a lesser included offense of

the crime of murder in the first degree.

Whoever commits murder in the second degree is guilty of a second degree felony resulting in the death of a human being."

Section 2. Section 30-2-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 303, Section 2-3, as amended) is amended to read:

"30-2-3. MANSLAUGHTER. -- Manslaughter is the [unlawful] killing of a human being [without malice] without lawful justification or excuse in circumstances that do not constitute murder.

Voluntary manslaughter consists of manslaughter committed upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion.

Whoever commits voluntary manslaughter is guilty of a third degree felony resulting in the death of a human being.

В. Involuntary manslaughter consists of manslaughter committed in the commission of an unlawful act not amounting to felony, [or] other than a minor traffic offense; in the commission of a lawful act [which] that might produce death in an unlawful manner; or in the commission of a lawful act performed without due caution and circumspection.

Whoever commits involuntary manslaughter is guilty of a fourth degree felony. <u>Involuntary manslaughter is a lesser</u> included offense of homicide by vehicle."
