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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 73-14-18 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1975,
17	Chapter 262, Section 1) is amended to read:
18	"73-14-18. ABOLITION OF BOARDS OF DIRECTORS OF DISTRICTS
19	HAVING MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND ACRES AND CREATED PRIOR TO
20	1930As [the same are] now constituted, any conservancy
21	district organized under the provisions of the Conservancy Act
22	of New Mexico and such conservancy district being created prior
23	to 1930 <u>and</u> embracing land situate in four or more counties and
24	having an appointed board of directors shall, after the election
25	and qualification of the board of directors, cease to have an

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appointed board of directors and in lieu thereof shall have an 1 elected board of directors as provided in Sections [75-28-11.1 2 through 75-28-11.15 NMSA 1953] 73-14-18 through 73-14-32 NMSA 3 1978, which board of directors shall bear the name "board of 4 directors of the _____ conservancy district" 5 and shall be a body corporate, may sue and be sued, shall have 6 the power to commission peace officers and which shall succeed 7 to, have, exercise, enjoy, assume and perform all of the rights, 8 powers, obligations and duties now by law vested in, conferred 9 upon, imposed upon or required of the boards [hereby] abolished 10 by this section." 11

Section 2. Section 73-14-52 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1951, Chapter 222, Section 4) is amended to read:

"73-14-52. ENFORCEMENT. -- Conservancy districts, having adopted <u>ordinances</u>, rules and regulations providing for <u>the</u> <u>protection of the bosque</u>, <u>district property and the citizens of</u> <u>New Mexico and for the distribution and allocation of irrigation</u> waters pursuant to the provisions of [this act] <u>Sections</u> <u>73-14-49 through 73-14-53 NMSA 1978</u>, shall have all powers available by law to enforce [the same] the rules, regulations and ordinances, including the right of injunction and mandamus. <u>A conservancy district with an elected board of directors that</u> <u>is organized pursuant to the Conservancy Act of New Mexico</u>, was <u>created prior to 1930</u>, <u>embraces land situate in four or more</u> <u>counties and includes more than one hundred thousand acres of</u>

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land may commission peace officers as deemed necessary by the 1 board of directors to enforce the rules, regulations and 2 criminal ordinances of that district or the laws or ordinances 3 of the state, county or municipality that has jurisdiction over 4 the site at which a crime has been committed." 5 Section 3. [NEW MATERIAL] **ENFORCEMENT- - CONSERVANCY** 6 DISTRICT PEACE OFFICERS. --7 The peace officer of a conservancy district that A. 8 has the power to commission peace officers is authorized to 9 perform all acts necessary to enforce the criminal ordinances, 10 rules and regulations of that conservancy district including: 11 (1) suppressing all riots, disturbances and 12 breaches of the peace; 13 apprehending all disorderly persons; (2)14 providing aid requested by any other law (3) 15 enforcement agency; 16 issuing citations, apprehending or (4) 17 arresting any person within the jurisdiction of the conservancy 18 district who is in the act of violating the law of the state or 19 the ordinances of the county, municipality or the conservancy 20 district and bring him before competent authority for detention 21 or trial; and 22 fulfilling the duties of a peace officer (5) 23 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 29, Article 1 NMSA 1978. **B**. In the discharge of his proper duties, a peace

2	be subject to the same responsibilities as sheriffs in similar			
3	cases.			
4	Section 4. EMERGENCYIt is necessary for the public			
5	peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
