AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN: CREATING A JUVENILE EDUCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, PROVIDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE EDUCATION OF CERTAIN CHILDREN; TRANSFERRING FUNDS; ENACTING A NEW SECTION OF THE CHILDREN'S CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Children's Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] JUVENILE EDUCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM CREATED--ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT--ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA--TRANSFER OF FUNDS--REGULATIONS. --

There is created a "juvenile education assistance program" within the children, youth and families department. The purpose of the program is to provide financial assistance for education annually for up to two thousand children who have

failed in public school, who are at risk of failing in public school or who have dropped out of public school.

- B. A child is eligible to receive financial assistance for education from the juvenile education assistance program if he meets the following criteria:
- (1) he has failed in public school, is at risk of failing in public school or has dropped out of public school due to factors including abuse or neglect, delinquency, chronic truancy, learning disabilities, substance abuse or emotional disorders:
- (2) the child's parent or guardian provides a written letter of commitment to use the financial assistance provided by the juvenile education assistance program to further the child's education:
- (3) the household income for the child's home does not exceed the median household income in New Mexico; and
- (4) the child's parent or guardian provides a written letter of recommendation from a judge who knows the child, a chief juvenile probation and parole officer who knows the child or the principal of the child's current or former public school, which letter of recommendation states that a different educational environment would improve the child's prospects for achieving success in school.
- C. Financial assistance provided by the juvenile education assistance program shall be provided in the form of

certificates. Each certificate shall equal the annual unit value for a student, as determined by the state department of public education.

- D. The child's parent or guardian shall use the certificate to help pay the cost of enrolling the child in a primary or secondary public, private or parochial school, provided that the school is accredited by the state department of public education.
- E. A primary or secondary public, private or parochial school may present a child's certificate to the children, youth and families department for redemption, provided that the certificate is accompanied by an affidavit attesting to the child's enrollment in the school.
- F. The state department of public education shall annually transfer funds to the children, youth and families department in an amount equal to redeemed certificates received by the children, youth and families department.
- G. The children, youth and families department shall bear the cost of administering the juvenile education assistance program.
- H. The children, youth and families department shall adopt regulations to implement and operate the juvenile education assistance program."
- Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1997.

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
