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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
17	"Parent Choice in Education Act".
18	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Parent Choice in
19	Education Act:
20	A. "department" means the state department of public
21	education;
22	B. "parent" means a natural parent, legal guardian
23	or any person having legal or effective custody of a student;
24	C. "private school" means a school offering on-site
25	programs of instruction not under the control, supervision or
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management of a local school board, exclusive of home
 instruction; and

D. "school choice certificate" means an instrument issued to parents that represents an amount of money to pay for educational services provided to a student in a private school.

Section 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF SCHOOL CHOICE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM - PURPOSE - ELIGIBILITY - ADMINISTRATION. - -

A. The purpose of the school choice certificate program is to provide alternative educational opportunities to low-income at-risk students in grades one through eight and to encourage active parental involvement with the goal of improving the educational outcome for these students.

B. Participation in the school choice certificate program shall be open to students currently enrolled in public school who are considered at risk and are from families whose income is at or below federal poverty guidelines. A parent shall enroll the student in the school choice certificate program. Enrollment constitutes agreement to comply with the requirements of the program.

D. The department shall develop and administer the school choice certificate program and shall establish procedures for enrollment in the program and distribution and redemption of school choice certificates. Full implementation of the school choice certificate program shall be accomplished no later than the beginning of fiscal year 1999. Specific and realistic

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schedules for implementation shall be determined by the department and participating private schools.

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Section 4. SCHOOL CHOICE CERTIFICATES -- VALUE -- FUNDING. --

A. The value of a school choice certificate shall be
two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).

B. School choice certificates shall be funded from money appropriated to the department.

Section 5. ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL CHOICE CERTIFICATES.--The department shall issue school choice certificates by June 15 of each year to parents who shall submit them to the participating school of their choice by July 15. The schools shall submit the school choice certificates for payment as agents of the parents to the department by August 1. The department as agent of the parents shall pay the value of the school choice certificates in two equal payments to the schools, one on September 1 and one on January 1. Appropriate adjustments shall be made for partialyear enrollment and transfers. Reasonable requirements for verifying enrollment shall be established by the department.

Section 6. ADMISSIONS.--Admission of a student participating in the school choice certificate program shall be governed by policies established by the school. Nothing in the Parent Choice in Education Act shall be construed to require any participating school to admit or retain any student in violation of school policies; provided that no participating school shall deny a student admission on the basis of race, color or national origin.

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Section 7. PARTICIPATION BY SCHOOLS. -- Participation in the school choice certificate program by private schools is optional and is open to any private schools in the state, providing it supplies documentation satisfactory to the department of compliance with all applicable fire, safety and health requirements. No private school shall be ineligible to participate in the school choice certificate program because it teaches moral values, philosophy or religion. A private school redeeming school choice certificates shall not be considered a recipient of federal assistance.

Section 8. CONTINUED PARTICIPATION BY STUDENTS.--In order for a student to remain eligible for participation in the school choice certificate program for a second year and subsequent school years, the school the student is attending must certify to the department by May 15 of each school year that the parent of the student is fully participating in appropriate support activities and the student's performance and behavior are satisfactory. If the school does not so certify, the student shall be ineligible to continue in the school choice certificate program in the next school year. At the end of a student's second year at a participating school, the school shall conduct a review of the student's academic achievement. If the student's academic achievement has not shown improvement, the school shall notify the department, and the student shall be
