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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:		
18	Section 1. Section 21-28-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 264,		
19	Section 2) is amended to read:		
20	"21-28-2. RESEARCH PARKPURPOSEThe purpose of the University		
21	Research Park Act is to promote the public welfare and prosperity of the people of		
22	New Mexico and foster economic development within the state by forging links be-		
23	tween the state's educational institutions, business and industrial communities and		
24	government through the development of research parks on university real property		
25	and through other cooperative ventures of innovative technological significance		
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1	[which] that will advance education, science, research, conservation, health care or		
2	economic development within the state."		
3	Section 2. Section 21-28-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 264,		
4	Section 3) is amended to read:		
5	"21-28-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the University Research Park Act:		
6	A. "bond" or "bonds" means any bond, note or other evidence of		
7	indebtedness;		
8	B. "regents" means the board of regents of a university;		
9	C. "research park" means research and development facilities,		
10	research institutes, testing laboratories, offices, light manufacturing, utility facilities		
11	health care facilities, businesses and government installations and similar facilities,		
12	together with land, including all necessary appurtenances, rights and franchises		
13	acquired, constructed and developed by a university or under its authority [which]		
14	that are suitable or necessary to promote the social welfare of the state of New		
15	Mexico through the advancement of education, science, research, conservation,		
16	health care, economic development and related purposes;		
17	D. "research park corporation" means any corporation formed		
18	pursuant to the provisions of the University Research Park Act;		
19	E. "technological innovations" means research, development,		
20	prototype assembly, manufacture, patenting, licensing, marketing and sale of		
20 21	inventions, ideas, practices, applications, processes, machines, technology and		
21	related property rights of all kinds; and		
22	F. "university" means a New Mexico educational institution		
23 24	established pursuant to the provisions of Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of		
	New Mexico."		
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Section 3. Section 21-28-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 264, 1 Section 6) is amended to read: 2 "21-28-6. POWERS OF RESEARCH PARK CORPORATION.--A research 3 park corporation shall have all the powers necessary and convenient to carry out 4 and effectuate the provisions of the University Research Park Act, including but not 5 limited to the power to: 6 A. [to] approve or disapprove [research] proposals; 7 B. [to] sue and be sued in its corporate name; 8 C. [to] purchase, take, receive or otherwise acquire, own, hold, use 9 and otherwise deal in and with real property or personal property, including 10 intangible personal property and intellectual property and technological innovations 11 or any interest therein; 12 D. [to] sell, convey, pledge, exchange, transfer and otherwise 13 dispose of all or any part of any of its assets and properties for such consideration 14 upon such terms and conditions as the corporation shall determine; provided that 15 any sale, conveyance, pledge, exchange, transfer or disposal of any real property 16 interest by a research park corporation shall be made in accordance with the provi-17 sions of Section 13-6-2 NMSA 1978; 18 E. [to] make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money at such 19 rates of interest as the research park corporation may determine; 20 F. [to] make and execute all contracts, agreements and instruments 21 necessary or convenient in the exercise of the powers and functions of the 22 corporation granted by [this] the University Research Park Act; 23 G. [to] receive and administer grants, contracts and private gifts; 24

H. [to] invest and reinvest its funds;

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1	I. [to] conduct its activities, carry on its operations, have offices and			
2	exercise the powers granted by the University Research Park Act;			
3	J. [to] make and alter bylaws, not inconsistent with the University			
4	Research Park Act, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of research			
5	park corporations, and such bylaws may contain provisions indemnifying any			
6	person who is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the corporation;			
7	K. [to] employ such officers and employees as it deems necessary,			
8	set their compensation and prescribe their duties;			
9	L. [to] enter into agreements with insurance carriers to insure against			
10	any loss in connection with its operations;			
11	M. [to] authorize retirement programs and other benefits for salaried			
12	officers and employees of the research park corporation;			
13	N. [to] employ fiscal consultants, attorneys and such other			
14	consultants and employees as may be required in its judgment and to fix and pay			
15	their compensation;			
16	O. [to] acquire, hold and dispose of intellectual property and			
17	technological innovations and enter into license agreements and contracts involving			
18	intellectual property and technological innovations such as patents, copyrights,			
19	franchises, trademarks and matters related thereto; and			
20	P. [to] do all things authorized by law not inconsistent with the			
21	provisions of the University Research Park Act."			
22	Section 4. Section 21-28-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 264,			
23	Section 7, as amended) is amended to read:			
24	"21-28-7. LIMITATIONS ON APPLICATION OF LAWSExcept as			
25	provided in this section, a research park corporation shall not be deemed an agency			
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1	or public body or other political subdivision of the state, including for purposes of		
2	applying statutes and laws relating to personnel, procurement of goods and services,		
3	meetings of the board of directors, gross receipts tax, disposition or acquisition of		
4	real or personal property, capital outlays, per diem and mileage and inspection of		
5	records. A research park corporation shall be deemed an agency or other political		
6	subdivision of the state for purposes of applying statutes and laws relating to the		
7	furnishing of goods and services to the university that operates it, the risk		
8	management fund, and a research park corporation, its officers, directors and		
9	employees shall be granted immunity from liability for any tort as provided in the		
10	Tort Claims Act. A research park corporation may also enter into agreements with		
11	insurance carriers to insure against any loss in connection with its operations even		
12	though the loss may be included among losses covered by the risk management		
13	fund of the state."
