15	Section 1. Section 27-2-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1973,				
16	Chapter 376, Section 10, as amended) is amended to read:				
17	"27-2-7. GENERAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM-QUALIFICATIONS AND				
18	PAYMENTS				
19	A. Subject to the availability of state funds,				
20	public assistance shall be provided under a general assistance				
21	program to or on behalf of <u>an</u> eligible [persons] <u>person</u> who				
22	meets all eligibility conditions pursuant to Section 27-2-3 NMSA				
23	<u>1978 and who</u> :				
24	[(1) are under eighteen years of age and meet				
25	all eligibility conditions for aid to families with dependent				
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1	children except the relationship to the person with whom they				
2	are living; or				
3	(2) are over the age of eighteen and are				
4	temporarily disabled, according to regulations of the board and				
5	are not receiving aid to families with dependent children; or				
6	(3) meet the qualifications under such other				
7	regulations for the general assistance program as the board				
8	shall establish from time to time.				
9	B. General assistance program payments may be made				
10	directly to the recipient or to the vendor of goods or services				
11	provided to the recipient. The board may by regulation limit				
12	the grants that are made to general assistance recipients.				
13	C. Whenever the board makes an adjustment in the

18	<u>(1) is under eighteen years of age and lives</u>				
19	with a caretaker that is not a parent or stepparent;				
20	(2) is over sixty years of age and the				
21	<u>caretaker of an eligible person under the age of eighteen;</u>				
22	(3) is the parent of an eligible person under				
23	the age of eighteen years, where the parent:				
24	(a) suffers from a permanent or temporary				
25	disability that prevents the parent from engaging in work;				

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1	(b) is providing care for a totally				
2	<u>disabled adult in the family;</u>				
3	<u>(c) is caring for a child with a</u>				
4	<u>disability who requires special parental care that cannot be</u>				
5	<u>provided through available daycare services;</u>				
6	(d) has received temporary assistance for				
7	needy families for more than sixty months; or				
8	<u>(e) is a lawfully resident noncitizen who</u>				
9	would be a person eligible for public assistance if the parent

11	(4) is over the age of eighteen and:				
12	(a) is either permanently or temporarily
