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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. PUBLIC REGULATION COMMITTEE CREATED
16	TERMINATIONThere is created a joint interim legislative
17	committee which shall be known as the "public regulation
18	committee". The committee shall function from the date of its
19	appointment until the first day of December prior to the first
20	session of the forty-fourth legislature.
21	Section 2. MEMBERSHIPAPPOINTMENTVACANCIES
22	A. The public regulation committee shall be composed
23	of ten members. Five members of the house of representatives
24	shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of
25	representatives, and five members of the senate shall be
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appointed by the committees' committee of the senate or, if the senate appointments are made in the interim, by the president pro tempore of the senate after consultation with and agreement of a majority of the members of the committees' committee.

B. Members shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two major political parties in each house the same proportional representation on the committee as prevails in each house; however, in no event shall either party have less than one member from each house on the committee. Vacancies on the committee shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the original appointments. The chairman and vice chairman of the committee shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate.

C. No action shall be taken by the committee if a majority of the total membership from either house on the committee rejects such action.

Section 3. DUTIES. -- After its appointment, the public regulation committee shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be submitted to the New Mexico legislative council for approval. Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the legislative council, the committee shall examine the statutes, constitutional provisions, regulations and court decisions governing public utilities, corporations, transportation companies, transmission and pipeline companies,

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insurance companies and other matters related to the establishment and authority of the new public regulation commission and recommend legislation or changes if any are found to be necessary to the second session of the forty-third legislature and the first session of the forty-fourth legislature.

Section 4. SUBCOMMITTEES.--Subcommittees shall be created only by majority vote of all members appointed to the public regulation committee and with the prior approval of the New Mexico legislative council. A subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the senate and one member from the house of representatives, and at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of the subcommittee. All meetings and expenditures of a subcommittee shall be approved by the full committee in advance of such meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall be shown in the minutes of the committee.

Section 5. REPORT.--The public regulation committee shall make an annual report of its findings and recommendations for the consideration of the legislature. The report and suggested legislation shall be made available to the New Mexico legislative council on or before December 15 preceding each session.

Section 6. STAFF.--The staff for the public regulation committee shall be provided by the legislative council service. Section 7. APPROPRIATION.--For the purpose of paying the

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1 salaries and expenses of the technical, legal, clerical and stenographic assistants, for necessary equipment and supplies 2 used in carrying out the provisions of this act and for 3 reimbursing the per diem and mileage expenses of the public 4 regulation committee, there is appropriated to the legislative 5 6 council service from the general fund the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). All or any part of this 7 appropriation may be expended in fiscal years 1997 through 1999, 8 9 and any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end 10 of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund. Payments from the appropriation shall be made upon vouchers signed by the 11 12 director of the legislative council service or his authorized 13 representative.

Section 8. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
