AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO IMPLEMENT PHASE ONE OF THE LYNDON B. JOHNSON MIDDLE SCHOOL TECHNOLOGY PLAN; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION. -- Three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$375,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state department of public education for expenditure in fiscal years 1997 and 1998 for the purpose of purchasing and installing computers, software and related hardware for phase one of the technology plan at the Lyndon B. Johnson middle school in Bernalillo county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 2. EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public
