16	Section 1. Section 28-13-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1977,

21	Section 2. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL]</u> PURPOSEBecause the federal
22	veterans' administration has no plans to establish or expand
23	national cemeteries in New Mexico, and it is evident that space
24	in the Santa Fe national cemetery will be depleted after the
25	year 2000, the legislature recognizes the state's obligation to

find a suitable alternative for the respectful interment of its veterans and the need to find land for the establishment of a veterans' cemetery. Parcels of state land have been identified as possible areas for a future veterans' cemetery, but studies need to be conducted to assess their appropriateness and the feasibility of such a project. If the state donates land for the purpose of building a veterans' cemetery, the federal veterans' administration has a state cemetery grants program through which the state could receive financial and maintenance assistance for the building and upkeep of the projected veterans' cemetery.

Section 3. A new section of the Veterans' Service Act is enacted to read:

ADDITIONAL POWERS--STATE VETERANS' "[<u>NEW MATERI</u>AL] CEMETERY FUND CREATED. -- The New Mexico veterans' service commission shall have general control over the collection and disbursement of all money collected or received pursuant to state law for the purpose of the formation of a state veterans' cemetery. There is created in the state treasury the "state veterans' cemetery fund". All money collected or received by the New Mexico veterans' service commission for purposes of establishing a state veterans' cemetery shall be deposited in the fund and is appropriated to the New Mexico veterans' service commission. Money appropriated to the fund shall not revert to the general fund. The fund shall include all income from the

2	Section 4. APPROPRIATIONFifty thousand dollars
3	(\$50,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state
4	veterans' cemetery fund for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for
5	the purpose of hiring necessary professionals to conduct a study
6	of parcels of state land in Rio Rancho in Sandoval county and
7	other available state lands and to assess their suitability for
8	a state veterans' cemetery. Any unexpended or unencumbered
9	balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall not
10	revert to the general fund.
