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1 possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the 2 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. 3 The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps 4 necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as 5 6 amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are 7 appropriated to the state highway and transportation department for the purpose of making road improvements and enhancements, 8 9 including design, development and construction work, to City 10 View drive, Rio drive and Rim court near Old Coors drive on the 11 west side of Albuquerque located in Bernalillo county. Anv 12 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 13 fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. 14 If the state highway and transportation department has not 15 certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section 16 17 shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
