23	disaster services volunteer by a nationally recognized disaster

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1 organization requests the services of the employee; and the employee receives the approval of his 2 (3) employer. 3 The personnel board shall establish by regulation **B**. 4 criteria to be used: 5 (1)by state employers to approve or disapprove 6 a special disaster leave request; 7 to ensure that a public employee has been 8 (2)9 certified as a disaster services volunteer: and 10 to ensure that the special disaster leave (3) shall not be deducted from the employee's regular leave. 11 12 For purposes of this section: С. 13 "public employee" means a regular, (1)14 nonprobationary employee of the state or its political 15 subdivisions; and 16 (2)"serious disaster" means, but is not limited to, a catastrophe such as a tornado, flood, hurricane, 17 18 blizzard or other calamity that results in widespread property 19 damage, general disruption, personal injury and death, or any combination of them, and that is of such magnitude as to require 20 21 assistance from outside the area immediately impacted by the 22 catastrophe. 23 - 2 -24 25
