AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICE OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROMOTING HISPANIC MUSIC THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the office of cultural affairs for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 so that the office of cultural affairs may contract for services to promote Hispanic music throughout the state. The promotion of Hispanic music shall include conducting of Hispanic music workshops, shows and concerts, awarding of scholarships to study Hispanic music and providing recognition of achievement for persons who produce and perform Hispanic music. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.
