16	Section 1. Section 22-8-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978,				
17	Chapter 128, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:				
18	"22-8-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Public School				
19	Finance Act:				
20	A. "ADM' or "MEM' means membership;				
	B. "membership" means the total enrollment of				
21	qualified students on the current roll of a class or school on a				
22	specified day. The current roll is established by the addition				
23	of original entries and reentries minus withdrawals.				
24	Withdrawals of students, in addition to students formally				
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withdrawn from the public school, [includes] include students 1 absent from the public school for as many as ten consecutive school days; 3

С. "basic program ADM" or "basic program MEM" means the MEM of qualified students but excludes the full-timeequivalent MEM in early childhood education and three- and fouryear old students receiving special education services;

D. "cost differential factor" is the numerical 8 expression of the ratio of the cost of a particular segment of 9 the school program to the cost of the basic program in grades 10 four through six; 11

"department" or "division" means the state Ε. department of public education;

F. "early childhood education ADM" or "early childhood education MEM' means the full-time-equivalent MEM of students attending approved early childhood education programs;

"full-time-equivalent ADM" or "full-time-G. equivalent MEM' is that membership calculated by applying to the MEM in an approved public school program the ratio of the number of hours per school day devoted to the program to six hours or the number of hours per school week devoted to the program to thirty hours;

"operating budget" means the annual financial H. plan required to be submitted by a local school board;

> Ι. "program cost" is the product of the total number

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of program units to which a school district is entitled
multiplied by the dollar value per program unit established by
the legislature;

J. "program element" is that component of a public school system to which a cost differential factor is applied to determine the number of program units to which a school district is entitled, including but not limited to MEM, full-timeequivalent MEM, teacher, classroom or public school;

K. "program unit" is the product of the programelement multiplied by the applicable cost differential factor;

L. "public money" or "public funds" means all money from public or private sources received by a local school board or officer or employee of a local school board for public use;

M. "qualified student" means a public school student who:

(1) has not graduated from high school;

(2) is regularly enrolled in one-half or more of the minimum course requirements approved by the state board for public school students; and

(3) is at least five years of age prior to12:01 a.m. on September 1 of the school year; or

(4) is at least three years of age at any time during the school year and is receiving special education services pursuant to regulation of the state board; or

(5) has not reached his twenty-second birthday

"[NEW MATERIAL] MULTITRACK YEAR-ROUND SCHOOL UNITS. --2 A school district that is operating a multitrack A. 3 year-round school is eligible for additional program units. The 4 number of additional program units to which a district is 5 entitled pursuant to this section is computed in the following 6 manner: 7 8

multitrack school MEM X .05 = units.

B. For the purposes of this section, "multitrack 9 school MEM" means the total membership of students enrolled in a 10 multitrack year-round school." 11

Section 4. APPROPRIATION. -- Four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the public school fund in fiscal year 1998 for distribution through the state equalization guarantee distribution for expenditure to school districts with approved multitrack year-round schools. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.

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
