23	A. It [shall be] <u>is</u> the duty of the New Mexico state
24	police to install and maintain complete systems for the

12	possessing a pistol or any other dangerous weapon;
13	(2) buying or receiving stolen property;

- (3) unlawful entry of a building;
- (4) escaping or aiding an escape from prison;
- (5) making or possessing a fraudulent or forged check or draft;
 - (6) petit larceny; and
- $\underline{(7)} \quad \text{unlawfully possessing or distributing} \\ \text{habit-forming narcotic drugs}.$
- B. The New Mexico state police may also obtain like information concerning persons who have been convicted of violating any of the military, naval or criminal laws of the United States or who have been convicted of a crime in any other state, country, district or province [which] that, if committed

C. The New Mexico state police may obtain, at the applicant's expense, fingerprints of applicants to the New Mexico state bar from the federal bureau of investigation pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 92-544 or any other applicable federal law. The New Mexico state police may provide the New Mexico board of bar examiners with criminal history records for applicants to the New Mexico state bar.

[C.] D. The New Mexico state police shall make a complete and systematic record and index \underline{of} all information obtained for the purpose of providing a convenient and expeditious method of consultation and comparison."
