19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding two hundred thousand
21	dollars (\$200,000) when the department of environment certifies
22	the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of
23	finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the
24	most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding
25	by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to

1 justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance 2 shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply 3 with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The 4 5 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the 6 department of environment for the purpose of designing, constructing and inspecting water and wastewater system 7 improvements in the city of Deming located in Luna county. 8 Any 9 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 10 fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the department of environment has not certified the need for 11 12 the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 13 authorization provided in this section shall be void. 14 Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public

peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
