18	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
19	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
20	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
21	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one million eight
22	hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000) when the New Mexico office
23	of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the
24	bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance
25	and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical

1 manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the 2 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. 3 The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps 4 necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as 5 6 amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the 7 purpose of planning, designing, constructing, equipping and 8 9 furnishing a new day care center and pre-school education center 10 in Littlewater, Sanostee Chapter located in San Juan county. 11 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 12 fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. 13 If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the 14 need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 15 1999, the authorization provided in this section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
