upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed 1 sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can 2 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board 3 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 4 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 5 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New 6 Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of completing 7 the construction of, furnishing and equipping a multipurpose 8 building for senior citizens and head start students in Red 9 Valley located in San Juan county. Any unexpended or 10 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 11 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the New 12 Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for 13 the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 14 authorization provided in this section shall be void. 15

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
