judges serving in eleventh judicial district A. divisions one, three, four and six who reside in San Juan county are transferred to divisions one, two, three and four respectively, of the fourteenth judicial district, together with all budgets, personnel, money, funds, appropriations, accounts, furniture, equipment, office supplies and other things of value and all contracts, debts, liabilities or other obligations attributable to those divisions;

B. the district attorney serving in eleventh judicial district division one, composed of San Juan county, is transferred to the fourteenth judicial district and shall retain all budgets, personnel, money, funds, appropriations, accounts, furniture, equipment, office supplies and other things of value and all contracts, debts, liabilities or other obligations attributable to division one; and

C. the district attorney serving in eleventh judicial district division two, composed of McKinley county, shall become the sole district attorney for the eleventh judicial district and shall retain all budgets, personnel, money, funds, appropriations, accounts, furniture, equipment, office supplies and other things of value and all contracts, debts, liabilities or other obligations attributable to division two.

Section 5. APPROPRIATION. --Seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the administrative office of the courts for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 to pay for salary, benefits, office supplies, materials and other costs associated with the creation of a fourteenth judicial district. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 5. TEMPORARY PROVISION -- JUDICIAL ELECTIONS. --

A. Candidates running for the position of district judge from divisions one, three, four and six of the eleventh judicial district shall reside in and be elected by the qualified electors of San Juan county at the general election held in 2001.

B. Candidates running for the position of district judge from divisions two and five of the eleventh judicial district shall reside in and be elected by the qualified electors of McKinley county at the general election held in 2001.
