15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 6-24-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995,
17	Chapter 155, Section 7) is amended to read:
18	"6-24-7. BOARD OF DIRECTORSDUTIESThe board shall
19	provide the authority with the private-sector perspective of a
20	large marketing enterprise and shall make every effort to
21	exercise sound and prudent business judgment in its management
22	and promotion of the lottery. It is the duty of the board to:
23	A. adopt all rules, policies and procedures
24	necessary for the establishment and operation of the lottery;
25	B. maximize the net revenue for the public purposes
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of the New Mexico Lottery Act and to that end assure that all 2 rules, policies and procedures adopted further revenue maximization: 3

С. appoint a chief executive officer, prescribe his qualifications, duties and salary and set the salaries of the other officers and employees of the authority;

D. approve, disapprove, amend or modify the annual budget recommended by the chief executive officer for the operation of the authority; provided that the annual budget for the operating expenses of the authority shall not exceed twelve percent of the projected gross annual revenue;

E. approve all major procurements and approve, disapprove, amend or modify the terms of such procurements recommended by the chief executive officer;

F. supervise the chief executive officer and the other officers and employees of the authority and meet with the chief executive officer at least once every three months to make and consider recommendations, set policies, determine types and forms of lottery games to be operated by the lottery and transact other necessary business;

conduct, with the chief executive officer, a G. continuing study of the lottery and other state lotteries to improve the efficiency, profitability and security of the authority and the lottery;

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H. prepare quarterly and annual reports and maintain

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records as required under the New Mexico Lottery Act; and

I. pursue any [and all] other matters necessary, desirable or convenient for the efficient and effective operation of lottery games, the continued entertainment and convenience of the public and the integrity of the lottery."

Section 2. Section 6-24-24 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 155, Section 24) is amended to read:

"6-24-24. DI SPOSITI ON OF REVENUE. --

A. As nearly as practical, an amount equal to at least fifty percent of the gross annual revenues from the sale of lottery tickets shall be returned to the public in the form of lottery prizes.

B. The authority shall transmit all net revenues to the state treasurer who shall deposit sixty percent of the revenues in the public school capital outlay fund for expenditure pursuant to the provisions of the Public School Capital Outlay Act and forty percent in the lottery tuition fund. Estimated net revenues shall be transmitted monthly to the state treasurer for deposit in the funds, provided the total amount of annual net revenues for the fiscal year shall be transmitted no later than August 1 each year.

C. In determining net revenues, operating expenses of the lottery include all costs incurred in the operation and administration of the lottery and all costs resulting from any contracts entered into for the purchase or lease of goods or

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services required by the lottery, including [but not limited to] the costs of supplies, materials, tickets, independent audit services, independent studies, data transmission, advertising, promotion, incentives, public relations, communications, commissions paid to lottery retailers, printing, distribution of tickets, purchases of annuities or investments to be used to pay future installments of winning lottery tickets, debt service and payment of any revenue bonds issued, contingency reserves, transfers to the reserve fund and any other necessary costs incurred in carrying out the provisions of the New Mexico Lottery Act. <u>Operating expenses of the lottery shall not exceed</u> twelve percent of the gross annual revenue of the lottery.

D. An amount up to two percent of the gross annual revenues shall be set aside as a reserve fund to cover bonuses and incentive plans for lottery retailers, special promotions for retailers, purchasing special promotional giveaways, sponsoring special promotional events, compulsive gambling rehabilitation and such other purposes as the board deems necessary to maintain the integrity and meet the revenue goals of the lottery. The board shall report annually to the governor and each regular session of the legislature on the use of the money in the reserve fund. Any balance in excess of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) at the end of any fiscal year shall be transferred to the lottery tuition fund. "

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the

13	maximum allowed shall be used to provide bonuses to lottery
14	employees. Bonuses shall be distributed in accordance with a
15	bonus plan adopted by the board that sets bonus amounts
16	commensurate with an employee's cost-savings responsibility. No
17	bonus for any one employee shall exceed ten thousand dollars
18	(\$10,000). The remaining amount of cost-savings realized shall be
19	considered net revenues for distribution as provided in this
20	section."".
