16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding two hundred fifty
21	thousand dollars (\$250,000) when the state agency on aging
22	certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state
23	board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the
24	bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible
25	upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed

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1 sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board 2 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 3 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The 4 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the 5 6 state agency on aging for the purpose of completing infrastructure, including site work, sewer and water lines, 7 electrical and propane, furnishing and paving the parking lot, 8 9 at Two Grey Hills elderly group home located in San Juan county. 10 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 11 fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. 12 If the state agency on agency has not certified the need for the 13 issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 14 authorization provided in this section shall be void. Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public 15

peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
