16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one million one
21	hundred sixty-nine thousand five hundred twenty-three dollars
22	(\$1,169,523) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs
23	certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state
24	board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the
25	bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible

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1 upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can 2 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board 3 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 4 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 5 The 6 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of planning, 7 designing and constructing recreational facilities and related 8 9 improvements for the Shiprock multipurpose complex located in 10 San Juan county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance 11 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the 12 severance tax bonding fund. If the New Mexico office of Indian 13 affairs has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in 14 15 this section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
