11	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE

16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. TEMPORARY PROVISION
18	A. The appropriation provided in Section 2 of this
19	act is to be used by the university of New Mexico school of
20	architecture and planning to investigate, study and report on
21	growth issues and impacts in six New Mexico communities,
22	counties or regions subject to high growth rates. The
23	evaluation shall:
24	(1) investigate different types of growth in
25	New Mexico and their particular impacts on communities, natural

1 resources, people and public and private facilities and infrastructure, as well as limits and issues related to 2 potential future growth; 3 (2) investigate the fiscal impacts of growth on 4 state, county and local taxpayers and local, county and state 5 6 government in the selected growth areas; 7 (3) investigate the efficacy and 8 appropriateness of existing enabling laws related to development 9 and land use, such as zoning regulation, historic districts and 10 landmarks, subdivisions and planning and platting, annexation of territory, regional planning, community development and urban 11 12 development; 13 (4) investigate problems such as the need for regional cooperation and the relationship between the planning 14 15 and development review and approval that may not be addressed by 16 the existing laws; 17 investigate policies and processes that (5) 18 would help: 19 (a) provide more certainty in determining 20 where new development should and should not occur; make more efficient use of land that 21 **(b)** 22 has already been developed, including a strong focus on job 23 creation and housing in established urban areas; (c) establish a legal and procedural 24 25 framework to create desired certainty and send appropriate . 115809. 1 - 2 -

1 economic signals to investors; and

(d) include communities, people and government in the process of managing future growth that may affect them; and

(6) consider the effects that such policiesmight have if applied or not applied in areas of the stateexperiencing slower growth.

B. The university of New Mexico school of architecture and planning shall coordinate this comprehensive evaluation with and seek appropriate involvement and support from the university of New Mexico bureau of business and economic research and the university of New Mexico institute of public law. The university of New Mexico may contract with appropriate professional to assist in the evaluation.

C. The comprehensive evaluation shall include a written report to be presented to the appropriate interim legislative committee no later than December 1, 1997. The comprehensive evaluation shall also include a public presentation of its findings and conclusions no later than December 31, 1997.

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the board of regents of the university of New Mexico for expenditure in fiscal years 1997 and 1998 for the purpose of funding a study by the school of architecture and planning to evaluate and report
