17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one hundred eighty-
21	three thousand dollars (\$183,000) when the New Mexico office of
22	Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds.
23	The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale
24	of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner
25	possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been

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1 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. 2 The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps 3 necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as 4 The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are 5 amended. 6 appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of purchasing and installing permanent fixtures in the 7 early childhood development center in Dulce located in Rio 8 9 Arriba county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining 10 at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has 11 bonding fund. 12 not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end 13 of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section 14 shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
