15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSES FOR WHICH
17	ISSUEDAPPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS
18	A. The state board of finance may issue and sell
19	severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding
20	Act in an amount not exceeding eighty-four thousand dollars
21	(\$84,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies
22	the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of
23	finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the
24	most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding
25	by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to

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1	justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to
2	contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance
3	shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply
4	with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The
5	proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New
6	Mexico office of Indian affairs in the following amounts for the
7	following purposes:
8	(1) fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) to
9	purchase and install fencing at the Sheep Springs chapter head
10	start school in San Juan county;
11	(2) fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) to
12	purchase and install fencing at the Naschitti chapter head start
13	school in San Juan county;
14	(3) fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) to
15	purchase and install playground equipment at the Two Grey Hills
16	chapter head start school in San Juan county;
17	(4) fourteen thousand dollars $(\$14,000)$ to
18	purchase and install playground equipment at the Nenahnezad
19	chapter head start school in San Juan county;
20	(5) fourteen thousand hundred dollars (\$14,000)
21	to purchase and install playground equipment at the Sanostee
22	chapter head start school in San Juan county; and
23	(6) fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) to
24	purchase and install playground equipment at the Red Valley
25	chapter head start school in San Juan county.
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1	B. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has
2	not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end
3	of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section
4	shall be void. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining
5	from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to
6	Subsection A of this section at the end of fiscal year 2000
7	shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.
8	Section 2. EMERGENCYIt is necessary for the public
9	peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
