AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR HEAD START SCHOOLS IN SAN JUAN COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSES FOR WHICH ISSUED--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$368,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed

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1 sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can
2 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board
3 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to
4 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The
5 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New
6 Mexico office of Indian affairs in the following amounts for the
7 following purposes:

8 (1) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
9 purchase and install fencing at the Beclabito chapter head start
10 school in San Juan county;

11 (2) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
12 purchase and install fencing at the Sheep Springs chapter head
13 start school in San Juan county;

14 (3) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
15 purchase and install fencing at the Naschitti chapter head start
16 school in San Juan county;

17 (4) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
18 purchase and install fencing at the Two Grey Hills chapter head
19 start school in San Juan county;

20 (5) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
21 purchase and install fencing at the Nenahnezad chapter head
22 start school in San Juan county;

23 (6) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
24 purchase and install fencing at the Shiprock chapter head start
25 school in San Juan county;

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1 (7) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
2 purchase and install fencing at the Hogback chapter head start
3 school in San Juan county; and

4 (8) forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) to
5 purchase and install fencing at the Red Valley chapter head
6 start school in San Juan county.

7 B. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has
8 not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end
9 of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section
10 shall be void. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining
11 from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to
12 Subsection A of this section at the end of fiscal year 2000
13 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

14 Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
15 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
