RELATING TO NATURAL RESOURCES; CREATING THE RIO GRANDE BOSQUE
ADVISORY COUNCIL TO ACT AS ADVISORY BODY TO BOSQUE MANAGEMENT
AGENCIES; ENACTING THE RIO GRANDE BOSQUE MANAGEMENT ACT; MAKING
AN APPROPRIATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Rio Grande Bosque Management Act".

### Section 2. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. --

A. The legislature finds that the Rio Grande bosque is an important natural resource that is undergoing rapid ecological change that endangers the future existence of native biological communities, especially riparian gallery forests of cottonwood and willow.

B. The institutional structure that manages the

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middle Rio Grande is composed of many federal, state, local and tribal entities that often operate independently to address irrigation, flood control, drainage needs, recreation, law enforcement and wildlife management without complete coordination to achieve ecosystem management and the balancing of compatible uses of the bosque.

- **C**. Those portions of the middle Rio Grande bosque that lie within Indian reservations are subject to management by individual Indian governments as sovereign entities.
- D. The middle Rio Grande conservancy district is one of the primary entities charged with managing the bosque and will play a major role in the coordination of ecosystem management.
- Section 3. DEFINITION. -- As used in the Rio Grande Bosque Management Act, "bosque" means:
- all land between the flood control levees. excepting the levees themselves, and the river bank from Cochiti reservoir to Elephant Butte reservoir, provided that where there are no levees, bosque includes the following:
- where there is a riverside drain, such (1)lands as exist between the riverside drain, excepting the riverside drain itself, and the river bank; or
- where there is no riverside drain, the **(2)** lands between the river bank and the limits of the historic flood plain; and

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B. all other lands that are ecological components of the middle Rio Grande riparian system, provided that the owners of the lands voluntarily agree to allow the Rio Grande bosque advisory council to offer suggestions for their management.

Section 4. RIO GRANDE BOSQUE ADVISORY COUNCIL--CREATED--MEMBERS.--

- A. The "Rio Grande bosque advisory council" is created to advise public and private landowners with the bosque as defined above, to promote coordination among all government agencies having authority in the bosque and to promote the protection and enhancement of bosque and river ecosystems.
- B. The Rio Grande bosque advisory council may consist of the following members or their designees as voting members according to the following categories:
- (1) the mayors of Albuquerque, Belen,
  Bernalillo, Bosque Farms, Corrales, Los Lunas, Los Ranchos de
  Albuquerque, Rio Rancho and Socorro;
- (2) the county commission chairmen from Bernalillo, Sandoval, Socorro and Valencia counties;
- (3) the governors of the following pueblos: Cochiti, Isleta, Sandia, San Felipe, Santa Ana and Santo Domingo;
- (4) one representative each from the United States army corps of engineers, the bureau of reclamation, the natural resources conservation service and the United States

fish and wildlife service:

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- a representative of the middle Rio Grande conservancy district;
- the secretary of energy, minerals and natural resources, the secretary of environment, the director of the department of game and fish, the state engineer, the commissioner of public lands and the chairman of the interstate stream commission:
- (7) two private bosque landowners nominated by the landowner committee; and
- one representative of a local organization in the middle Rio Grande region that is dedicated to protection and enhancement of the bosque or the river and one representative of a regional or national environmental The environmental representatives shall be organi zati on. designated by the speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate and shall be individuals who have an established knowledge of issues affecting the river and the bosque and who have been involved in attempting to protect and enhance bosque and river ecosystems.
- The business of the Rio Grande bosque advisory council between meetings shall be conducted by an eight-member executive committee, with one member selected from each category of membership as set forth in Subsection B of this section.
  - The secretary of energy, minerals and natural

resources or his designee shall serve as the chairman of the Rio Grande bosque advisory council for the first fiscal year of the council, and thereafter a chairman shall be elected by the membership of the council.

- E. The Rio Grande bosque advisory council shall hold at least two open meetings each year. The executive committee shall meet as needed. The council shall promulgate public notice of each meeting and provide interested members of the public with the opportunity to present written and oral comments.
- F. The Rio Grande bosque advisory council is administratively attached to the energy, minerals and natural resources department but shall have authority, independent of the department, to carry out its assigned functions as defined by the Rio Grande Bosque Management Act.
- G. Members of the Rio Grande bosque advisory council not otherwise eligible shall receive per diem and mileage as provide for nonsalaried public officers in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

### Section 5. COUNCIL--POWERS AND DUTIES. --

A. The Rio Grande bosque advisory council shall adopt, after a public hearing, a set of principles to advise appropriate government agencies on actions that may affect the bosque. The principles shall be based on the concept that the

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bosque is an integrated system of biological, physical, social and cultural components. The principles shall encourage the protection and enhancement of bosque and river ecosystems, and in formulating the principles, the council shall review, implement and update to the extent possible the recommendations from the report, "middle rio grande ecosystem: bosque conservation of the middle rio grande bosque".

- В. The Rio Grande bosque council shall act as advisory council to the middle Rio Grande conservancy district regarding the management of bosque lands within the boundaries of the district. The council shall also advise other management authorities, landowners and regulatory agencies that own, control or exercise authority within the bosque.
- C. The Rio Grande bosque advisory council shall request participating agencies to enter into a memorandum of agreement for cooperation in implementing the set of principles established pursuant to Subsection A of this section and in undertaking coordinated resource management programs for the bosque.
  - D. The Rio Grande bosque advisory council shall:
- (1) maintain information on the biological, physical, social and cultural conditions in the bosque;
- establish an information clearinghouse for (2)public comment and distribution of information to the public;
  - (3) foster mediation to resolve conflicts and

disputes regarding the bosque;

- (4) publish an annual "state of the bosque report" and report annually to the appropriate interim committees of the legislature and to the board of the middle Rio Grande conservancy district; and
- of members of the council and members of the public. One committee shall be a landowner committee and one shall be a committee composed of private citizens. The citizen committee shall have authority to consider any and all matters affecting the welfare of the bosque and to receive oral and written public comments. Prior to the issuance of the council's state of the bosque report, the citizen committee shall submit a written report and recommendations for the council's consideration. The council shall review the citizen committee's report and recommendations for possible incorporation into the state of the bosque report.
- E. In order to carry out its duties, the Rio Grande bosque advisory council shall have the following powers:
- adopt bylaws to govern the structure and operations of the council and council meetings;
- (2) solicit and administer grants and in-kind services and use its funds as the local cost share to obtain federal funding for projects to assist it in carrying out its obligations under the Rio Grande Bosque Management Act; and

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Section 6. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE--POWERS AND DUTIES.--The executive committee of the Rio Grande bosque advisory council shall:

- A. employ and fix the compensation of those employees necessary to discharge the duties of the council;
- B. set executive committee and full council meeting dates, locations and agendas;
- C. prepare draft advisory principles on government actions that affect the bosque, taking into consideration the reports and recommendations of the council and the citizen and landowner committees;
- D. prepare and disseminate an annual "state of the bosque report";
  - E. develop an annual budget; and
- F. be subject to the provisions of the Open Meetings Act.

Section 7. APPROPRIATION.--One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the energy, minerals and natural resources department for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for the purpose of establishing the Rio Grande bosque advisory council to coordinate government resource management actions of the middle Rio Grande bosque. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 8. TERMINATION -- DELAYED REPEAL. -- The Rio Grande bosque advisory council is terminated on July 1, 2007 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The council shall continue to operate pursuant to the Rio Grande Bosque Management Act until July 1, Effective July 1, 2008, the Rio Grande Bosque Management Act is repealed.
