AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR HEAD START SCHOOLS IN MCKINLEY AND SAN JUAN COUNTIES; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED--Section 1. APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS. --

The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to

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justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs in the following amounts for the following purposes:

- three thousand seven hundred dollars **(1)** (\$3,700) to purchase and install fencing at the Navajo head start school in McKinley county;
- three thousand seven hundred dollars (\$3,700) to purchase and install fencing at the Coal Mine head start school in McKinley county;
- three thousand seven hundred dollars (3)(\$3,700) to purchase and install fencing at the Tohatchi head start school in McKinley county;
- four thousand eight hundred dollars (\$4,800) to purchase and install fencing at the Rock Springs head start school in McKinley county;
- three thousand seven hundred dollars (5)(\$3,700) to purchase and install fencing at the Twin Lakes head start school in McKinley county;
- three thousand seven hundred dollars **(6)** (\$3,700) to purchase and install fencing at the Crystal head start school in San Juan county; and

If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining shall be void. from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Subsection A of this section at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
