AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A WATER DIVERSION STUDY IN COYOTE CANYON IN MCKINLEY COUNTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION. -- Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the department of environment for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for the purpose of conducting a study on diverting water away from consistently flooded housing in Coyote Canyon in McKinley county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.
