16	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
17	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
18	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
19	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding forty-two thousand
20	dollars (\$42,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs
21	certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state
22	board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the
23	bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible
24	upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed
25	sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can

1 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 2 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 3 The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New 4 Mexico office of Indian affairs to purchase a bus to transport 5 6 children to and from school and on field trips and other related learning experiences at Church Rock chapter located in McKinley 7 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the 8 county. 9 end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax 10 bonding fund. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has 11 not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end 12 of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section 13 shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
