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AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRONIC INFORMATION: ENACTING THE ELECTRONIC ACCESS ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE. -- This act may be cited as the "Electronic Access Act".

Section 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. -- The legislature finds that it is now feasible in this electronic age to distribute public information, including proposed and enacted state laws, regulations, rulings and reported judicial decisions, by way of electronic medium, including the internet and its branches, in order to better inform the public of state laws and judicial decisions and to provide easy and free access to those The legislature declares that the purpose of the documents. Electronic Access Act is to make that information available to

the public in a timely manner and at the least possible cost.

Section 3. DEFINITION.--As used in the Electronic Access

Act, "electronic form" includes publication on the worldwide web

and other branches of the internet and includes providing

members of the public, upon request, the information described

in Section 4 of that act in electronic formats, including

computer disks.

Section 4. INFORMATION PROVIDED. -- The legislative council service and the New Mexico compilation commission shall, on or before July 1, 1997, make all of the following information and documents available to the public in electronic form:

A. the legislative calendar, the schedule of legislative committee hearings, a list of matters pending on the floors of both houses of the legislature and a list of the committees of the legislature and their members;

- B. the full text of each bill introduced in each current legislative session, including all amendments and substitutions:
- C. the history of each bill introduced and amended in each current legislative session;
- D. a means by which the public may easily search the data base of all bills introduced in each legislative session by subject, title or sponsor;
- E. the status of each bill introduced and amended in each current legislative session;

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- F. all vote information concerning a bill introduced in each current legislative session;
 - G. the current NMSA 1978;
 - H. the constitution of New Mexico;
- I. all reported judicial decisions issued by New Mexico courts;
 - J. the full text of the New Mexico register;
- K. the full text of the New Mexico Administrative
 Code:
- L. the full text of any rule filed by any state agency with the records center; and
- M any other information or documents copyrighted by the state relating to the information described in this section.

Section 5. PUBLIC ACCESS. --

A. The information and documents described in Section 4 of the Electronic Access Act shall be made available to the public by means of access by way of the public computer network commonly referred to as the internet. The information shall also be made available in one or more formats, including computer disks and bulletin boards, and by one or more means in order to provide the greatest feasible access by the public to the information described in Section 4 of that act. Any person who accesses that information may access all or any part of the information. All information and documents described shall be kept current and updated in the shortest feasible time after the

service or the New Mexico compilation commission.

- B. Personal information concerning a person who accesses the information may be maintained only for the purpose of providing service to that person and shall not be sold, disclosed or otherwise disseminated.
- C. No fee or other charge may be imposed upon any member of the public for accessing or receiving the information or documents in the forms described in Section 4 of the Electronic Access Act. However, the legislative council service or the New Mexico compilation commission may charge a reasonable fee for providing the information described on computer disk, not to exceed one dollar (\$1.00) per disk. The legislative council service or the New Mexico compilation commission may also allow members of the public to provide their own computer disks for the purpose of receiving the information described, subject to those safeguards as the agencies deem necessary to protect the integrity of the system or data.
- D. The electronic access provided through the internet shall be in addition to other electronic distribution of the information described.
- E. No action taken pursuant to the Electronic Access Act shall alter or relinquish any copyright or other proprietary interest or entitlement of the state relating to any of the information made available pursuant to that act.
