The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of purchasing and installing pipes for a water conservation project in the Cudeii Navajo chapter located in San Juan county. unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
