15	Section 1. Section 3-13-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1965,
16	Chapter 300, Section 14-12-3, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"3-13-3. APPOINTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL ADMINISTRATORDUTIES
18	AND QUALIFICATIONS
19	A. The governing body of any municipality having a
20	population of one thousand or more persons may provide [for a
21	manager either by ordinance or by an election to be called by
22	the governing body upon the filing of a petition containing the
23	signatures of at least ten percent of the registered voters in
24	the municipality. The office of manager shall carry the same
25	qualifications, duties and responsibilities as provided for a

1	manager under Sections 3-14-13 through 3-14-15 NMSA 1978] by
2	ordinance for a professional administrator. The administrator
3	shall be supervised by the mayor. The administrator shall:
4	(1) enforce and carry out all ordinances, rules
5	and regulations enacted by the governing body;
6	(2) prepare and submit an annual budget;
7	(3) recommend to the mayor qualified persons to
8	<u>be appointed as employees or officers of the municipality; and</u>
9	(4) make recommendations to the mayor and the
10	governing body on all matters concerning the welfare of the
11	<u>muni ci pal i ty.</u>
12	<u>B. The administrator shall have a seat, but no vote,</u>
13	at every meeting of the governing body.
14	<u>C. The administrator shall be appointed by the mayor</u>
15	with the approval of the governing body.
16	<u>D. Unless reappointed, no administrator shall be</u>
17	employed beyond the day of the organizational meeting required
18	<u>in Section 3-11-5 NMSA 1978.</u> "
