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## SENATE BILL 1227

## AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT OF PERSONAL SERVICES FOR COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS; AMENDING AND ENACTING SECTIONS OF THE PROCUREMENT CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Procurement Code, Section 13-1-117.3 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

"13-1-117.3. [NEW MATERIAL] COUNTIES--REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS--PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS.--A county with regard to public works projects may in the interest of economy and efficiency consolidate and categorize one or more like projects for public works in the fiscal year under a single-fiscal-year program designation regardless of the individual funding sources for each of the programs contained in the designation. For any single-fiscal-year program designation, the county may issue one request for proposals for each of the professional services

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Section 2. Section 13-1-120 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984, Chapter 65, Section 93, as amended) is amended to read:

COMPETITIVE SEALED QUALIFICATIONS-BASED "13-1-120. PROPOSALS- - ARCHI TECTS- - ENGI NEERS- - LANDSCAPE ARCHI TECTS- -SURVEYORS--SELECTION PROCESS. --

For each proposed state public works project [or] local public works project or single-fiscal-year program designation of a county, the architect, engineer, landscape architect and surveyor selection committee, state highway and transportation department selection committee or local selection committee, as appropriate, shall evaluate statements of qualifications and performance data submitted by at least three businesses in regard to the particular project and may conduct interviews with and may require public presentation by all businesses applying for selection regarding their qualifications, their approach to the project and their ability to furnish the required services.

- В. The selection committee shall select, ranked in the order of their qualifications, no less than three businesses deemed to be the most highly qualified to perform the required services, after considering the following criteria together with any criteria, except price, established by the using agency authorizing the project:
  - specialized design and technical competence (1)

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of the business, including a joint venture or association, regarding the type of services required;

- (2) capacity and capability of the business to perform the work, including any specialized services, within the time limitations:
- (3) past record of performance on contracts with government agencies or private industry with respect to such factors as control of costs, quality of work and ability to meet schedules:
- (4) proximity to or familiarity with the area in which the project is located;
- (5) the amount of design work that will be produced by a New Mexico business within this state; and
- (6) the volume of work previously done for the entity requesting proposals which is not seventy-five percent complete with respect to basic professional design services, with the objective of effecting an equitable distribution of contracts among qualified businesses and of assuring that the interest of the public in having available a substantial number of qualified businesses is protected; provided, however, that the principle of selection of the most highly qualified businesses is not violated.
- C. Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsections A and B of this section, if fewer than three businesses have submitted a statement of qualifications for a particular

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project, the committee may:

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- (1) rank in order of qualifications and submit to the secretary or local public body for award those businesses which have submitted a statement of qualifications; or
- **(2)** recommend termination of the selection process and sending out of new notices of the proposed procurement pursuant to Section 13-1-104 NMSA 1978.
- D. The names of all businesses submitting proposals and the names of all businesses, if any, selected for interview shall be public information. After an award has been made, final ranking and evaluation scores for all proposals shall become public information. Businesses which have not been selected shall be so notified in writing within twenty-one days after an award is made."

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
