17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. Section 21-1-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1912,
19	Chapter 83, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"21-1-1. [ID.] STATE INSTITUTIONS[SUPPORT AND
21	MAINTENANCE; STUDENTS EXAMINATION] ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO BE
22	<u>ESTABLI SHED BY BOARDS OF REGENTS</u> [Sec. 145.]
23	<u>A.</u> The respective boards of regents of [the New
24	Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, the New Mexico
25	School of Mines] <u>New Mexico state university. New Mexico</u>
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<u>institute of mining and technology</u>, the university of New Mexico and the New Mexico military institute at Roswell shall determine and fix the standard of requirements for admission to their respective institutions.

B. In determining the standard of requirements for 5 6 admission to their respective institutions, boards of regents 7 shall not require a student who has completed the requirements of a home-based or non-public school educational program, and 8 9 who has submitted test scores that otherwise qualify him for admission to that institution, to obtain or submit proof of 10 11 having obtained a general education development certificate. In 12 determining requirements for admission, boards of regents shall 13 evaluate and treat applicants from home-based educational 14 programs or non-public schools fairly and in a nondiscriminatory 15 manner."

Section 2. Section 22-1-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1975, Chapter 338, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-1-4. FREE PUBLIC SCHOOLS--EXCEPTIONS--WITHDRAWING AND ENROLLING.--

A. Except as provided by Section 24-5-2 NMSA 1978, a free public school education shall be available to any schoolage person who is a resident of this state and has not received a high school diploma or its equivalent.

B. A free public school education in those courses already offered to persons under Subsection A of this section

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shall be available to any person who is a resident of this state and has received a high school diploma or its equivalent if there is available space in such courses.

C. Any person entitled to a free public school education under this section may enroll or re-enroll in a public school at any time and, unless required to attend school pursuant to the Compulsory School Attendance Law, may withdraw from a public school at any time.

9 D. Local school boards shall promulgate regulations 10 concerning the enrollment and re-enrollment of all persons. In adopting and promulgating non-discriminatory regulations 11 12 concerning the enrollment of students transferring from a home 13 school or private school to the public schools, the local school 14 board shall provide that the grade level at which the 15 transferring student is placed is appropriate to the age of the 16 student, to the student's score on a student achievement test 17

administered according to the statewide and local school

district testing programs as determined by the state

superintendent, or both."
