A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT ENGAGE IN A BROAD-BASED PROCESS OF REVIEW, WITH FULL PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT, OF THE PROPOSED MEDICAID MANAGED CARE PLAN BEFORE IMPLEMENTING THE PLAN.

WHEREAS, the human services department has submitted a waiver request to the federal government proposing major changes to the New Mexico medicaid program; and

WHEREAS, the department has simultaneously released a request for proposal seeking contractors to provide services to the medicaid population under a capitated arrangement and plans implementation of the contract as early as February 1997; and

WHEREAS, the proposed changes will entail substantially different management and administration of a very large and complex program and potentially put at risk the care medicaid

recipients are currently receiving as well as the fiscal stability of the program, and

WHEREAS, the department has reported that serious current and projected shortfalls exist in the funding of medicaid that will require additional legislative appropriations; and

WHEREAS, the United States congress is expected to address reform of the medicaid program and reduce the rate of growth, which will limit the amount of federal dollars for New Mexico's medicaid program; and

WHEREAS, the legislature and the general public have had inadequate exposure to the details of the medicaid managed care proposal and insufficient opportunity to evaluate the effect of the proposed changes on the beneficiary population or the potential for cost savings; and

WHEREAS, the state executive and legislative branches share responsibility for assuring adequate health care coverage for the vulnerable and poor who make up the medicaid population in New Mexico as well as assuring the fiscal viability of the medicaid program; and

WHEREAS, a review of the proposal to convert the medicaid program to a capitated, managed care program needs to include a full opportunity for broad public input prior to implementation of the program; and

WHEREAS, the legislature should be given the opportunity to review fully significant changes in covered services or

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eligibility before the human services department implements revisions to the medicaid program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department, in consultation with other state agencies using medicaid funds, engage in a full review of the proposed medicaid managed care plan before implementing the plan, including:

- A. the development, through a broad-based public process of a consensus on values to guide medicaid spending, resource allocation and managed care principles;
- B. an analysis of the impact on other health services and on the full medical d program of the proposed changes, including:
- (1) the costs incurred by the state, county indigent funds and private insurance providers and policyholders;
- (2) the costs of uncompensated care incurred by providers;
- (3) the effect on the existing network of providers and the infrastructure of health services in rural New Mexico; and
- (4) the care received by persons affected by proposed changes, including the care received by special needs populations and persons with terminal or progressive illnesses;
 - C. full consideration of whether the program could

reduce costs by entering into contracts for medicaid managed care to cover separate geographic regions in the state, rather than on a complete statewide basis;

- D. the development and use of a public review process that includes a series of public hearings and seeks testimony and information from a wide range of interested persons, including legislative and executive representatives, advocates for senior citizens, handicapped persons, mental health consumers, low-income individuals and medicaid recipients and providers or potential providers of services for the medicaid program;
- E. the use of committees or advisory groups as deemed necessary or appropriate to conduct a review of the medicaid managed care proposal for the purpose of responding to proposed changes and making recommendations to the human services department, provided that the membership of any committee reflect the ethnic, economic and geographic diversity of New Mexico; and
- F. the allowance of additional and sufficient time for full participation of the public to respond to the proposed medicaid managed care plan and increased time prior to implementation of the contract for medicaid managed care; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the human services department consider and incorporate, where appropriate, the opinions expressed in the public review process, as well as the

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recommendations of committees and advisory groups prior to implementing the plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the human services department present a progress report to the appropriate interim legislative committees by September 1, 1997 and that the proposed final findings and conclusions of the human services department be reported to the appropriate interim legislative committees before making final revisions and implementing the plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the waiver request to the federal government proposing major changes to the New Mexico medicaid program be withdrawn or denied by the responsible federal authorities until a full public review process is completed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the secretary of human services, the governor, the secretary of the United States department of health and human services and the administrator of the federal health care financing admi ni strati on.
