16	WHEREAS, great variation exists in the state with regard to
17	access to and delivery of health care services; and
18	WHEREAS, different areas of the state have different
19	service capacities and supplies; and
20	WHEREAS, regionally based purchasing of publicly funded
21	health insurance, including regionalization of the medicaid
22	program, has been demonstrated in other states to control health
23	care costs and stimulate more effective use of the health care
24	marketplace; and
25	WHEREAS, in a formal study conducted by the nationally
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recognized Lewin consulting group for the New Mexico health policy commission, it was projected that regionally based purchasing of publicly funded health insurance could potentially control health care costs and stimulate more effective use of the health care marketplace in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, managed care has a limited penetration in many rural areas of the state; and

WHEREAS, regionally based health care plans have the potential to better meet the needs of each regional area due to the knowledge and recommendations gained from community-based providers; and

WHEREAS, conditions in many rural parts of the state, including the availability of health professionals, infrastructure and density, present unique challenges to the development of managed care; and

WHEREAS, government is a major purchaser of health care in New Mexico, and as such changes in the state's method of purchasing publicly funded insurance may have significant effects throughout the state's entire health care delivery system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico health policy commission be requested to convene a task force to determine appropriate geographic regions in the state for health care delivery, identify market conditions and infrastructure that will promote

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regionalization of health care delivery and clarify financial, quality assurance, certification, filing and reporting requirements and other provisions necessary to promote regionally based health care services purchased by publicly funded health insurance, including medicaid; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico health policy commission include on the task force representatives of the department of health, the risk management division of the general services department, the public school insurance authority, the Albuquerque public school system, the department of insurance, the medical assistance division of the human services department, the retiree health care authority and representatives of health care providers, facilities and insurers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a method be established to gather data and information to assess and monitor the impact of a regionally based purchasing strategy for publicly funded health care and its effects on the state's health delivery system, the insurance market and access to care for the uninsured; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a report of the findings and recommendations of the task force be presented to the appropriate interim legislative committee by September 30, 1997; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent
