A JOINT MEMORIAL

SUPPORTING THE GUADALUPE-HIDALGO TREATY LAND CLAIMS ACT OF 1997

AND ENCOURAGING THE NEW MEXICO CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO TAKE

ALL NECESSARY ACTION TO ENSURE ITS ENACTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo was signed by the United States of America and the Mexican Republic on February 2, 1848; and

WHEREAS, the official name of the Treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo is the Treaty of Peace, Friendship, Limits and Settlement between the United States and the Mexican Republic; and

WHEREAS, the government of the Mexican Republic ceded to the United States the territory that became the states of Arizona, California, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah and part of the state of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the Treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo guarantees owners of property and their heirs rights of ownership; and

WHEREAS, provisions of the Treaty have not yet been fully implemented; and

WHEREAS, serious questions remain unresolved regarding the prior ownership of lands in the state of New Mexico, especially public lands; and

WHEREAS, the Guadalupe-Hidalgo Treaty Land Claims Act of 1997, introduced in the United States House of Representatives as H. R. 260, would establish the Guadalupe-Hidalgo Treaty Land Claims Commission which will hear and resolve land claims brought by the heirs and descendants of Mexican citizens living in the territories ceded to the United States; and

WHEREAS, any ten or more eligible descendants who are also heirs to the same community land grant may file with the commission a petition on behalf of themselves and all other heirs to that land grant seeking a determination of the validity of the land claim on which the petition is based; and

WHEREAS, the Guadalupe-Hidalgo Treaty Land Claims Act of 1997 shall establish a Community Land Grant Study Center to be located in Velarde, New Mexico at the Onate center to assist in researching the historic basis of each petition filed with the commission;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico congressional delegation be
