A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONSULT WITH HOSPITALS TO DEVELOP GUIDELINES TO MAKE HOSPITALS ACCESSIBLE TO PERSONS WITH MULTIPLE CHEMICAL SENSITIVITIES.

WHEREAS, the national academy of sciences has estimated that fifteen percent of the population is experiencing increased allergic sensitivity to everyday chemicals; and

WHEREAS, severe chemical sensitivity can be disabling and is known as multiple chemical sensitivities; and

WHEREAS, multiple chemical sensitivities is recognized as a potentially disabling condition by the social security administration and the United States department of housing and urban development; and

WHEREAS, persons with multiple chemical sensitivities experience adverse health reactions when exposed to many common

chemicals, including pesticides, carpets, perfumes, disinfectants and cleaning products found in most hospitals; and

WHEREAS, persons with multiple chemical sensitivities may require hospitalization in an acute care facility due to the exacerbation of their condition, the need for surgery or because of an accident or other medical problem and may require long or intermediate care in a nursing or rehabilitation facility; and

WHEREAS, people with the condition have been known to avoid emergency and hospital care because exposure to the hospital environment would make them worse; and

WHEREAS, multiple chemical sensitivities is covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, which guarantees access to public accommodations for people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, a patient may not be denied appropriate hospital care because of a handicap according to the New Mexico regulations governing general and special hospitals; and

WHEREAS, chemical barriers that block access for people with multiple chemical sensitivities are analogous to physical barriers that block access for people using wheelchairs; and

WHEREAS, Holy Cross hospital in Taos has set an example by constructing and maintaining a hospital wing that is designed to be accessible to patients with multiple chemical sensitivities; and

WHEREAS, many accommodations for chemically sensitive

patients are inexpensive, easy to implement and will provide a more healthful environment for other patients and hospital personnel;

NOW. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico department of health, with the cooperation of the governor's committee on concerns of the handicapped, consult with hospital representatives, hospital associations and individuals with multiple chemical sensitivities to develop written guidelines for making hospitals licensed in New Mexico accessible to patients with multiple chemical sensitivities: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that guidelines be submitted to the interim legislative health and human services committee at its October 1997 meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the department of health and the governor.
