A JOINT MEMORIAL

SUPPORTING A COOPERATIVE EFFORT BY THE STATE LAND OFFICE AND THE ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT RELATED TO NATURAL GAS MARKETING.

WHEREAS, the natural gas industry is an important contributor to the New Mexico economy; and

WHEREAS, a healthy, competitive natural gas industry is essential to economic development in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the natural gas industry is a significant source of employment in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the severance taxes, gross receipts taxes and property taxes generated by New Mexico's natural gas industry are an important source of revenues for state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, the royalties paid on natural gas produced from

state trust lands are a major source of the money invested in New Mexico's land grant permanent funds; and

WHEREAS, the earnings from the land grant permanent funds are an important source of support for New Mexico's educational institutions; and

WHEREAS, the legislature has appropriated funds to study the interstate natural gas pipeline system as it affects distribution of natural gas produced in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the legislature has appropriated funds to promote the sale and use of New Mexico's natural gas;

NOW. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state land office and the energy, minerals and natural resources department continue their cooperative efforts to identify new market opportunities and to encourage the use of natural gas produced in New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, using the information collected by the office of interstate gas marketing in its study of the interstate natural gas pipeline system and other research, the state land office and the energy, minerals and natural resources department be encouraged to work with industry to develop and promote flexible and innovative use of interstate pipeline systems and marketing arrangements so that producers of New Mexico's natural gas can reach the broadest possible market and take maximum advantage of market conditions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state land office and the

energy, minerals and natural resources department be directed to research those legal and economic factors that affect the net price received by producers of natural gas and to take steps to encourage legislative and regulatory action that will result in high net prices; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state land office and the energy, minerals and natural resources department be encouraged to work with industry to explore different means by which producers can aggregate natural gas so as to facilitate sales to users and reach new markets; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state land office and the energy, minerals and natural resources department be encouraged to continue their efforts to provide legislators, industry, state and federal agencies and the public an opportunity to participate in developing strategies to broaden the markets for New Mexico's natural gas; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the state land office and the energy, minerals and natural resources department.
