A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE APPROPRIATE INTERIM COMMITTEE CONSIDERING WATER ISSUES TO INCLUDE CONSIDERATION OF BENEFICIAL USE AND WATER RIGHTS CONSERVATION.

WHEREAS, New Mexico is a dry state, receiving as little as six inches of precipitation a year in some areas, which had particularly acute consequences during the drought of 1996, resulting in wildfires and crop losses; and

WHEREAS, the state has nine times the population it had in 1900, and in recent years, the state has had several of the fastest-growing communities in the country, with the population of Santa Fe alone increasing more than thirty percent since 1980; and

WHEREAS, increasing population puts severe stress on the state's natural resources, especially water, and the only source

of new water in New Mexico is derived from conserved water or by watershed management to achieve increased yield; and

WHEREAS, water rights conservation is not encouraged under New Mexico law, which is based on the sparser population and cultural practices in New Mexico under territorial governments in the early centuries of settlement; and

WHEREAS, the rights to use water are based on the concept of beneficial use and water rights are subject to forfeiture for non-use: and

WHEREAS, several measures were introduced during the 1997 legislative session to address water management, including House Bill 928, which would have redefined beneficial use to include water rights conservation; and

WHEREAS, House Joint Memorial 90 requests the continuation of an interim committee to review water policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that any interim committee directed by the New Mexico legislative council to review water policy include in its work plan the review of state water law that deals with beneficial use, diversion rights, consumptive rights and conservation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the co-chairs of the New Mexico legislative council.
