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15	WHEREAS, for many years the corrections department and the
16	children, youth and families department have experienced
17	difficulty in forecasting and managing increases in adult
18	corrections and juvenile justice system populations; and
19	WHEREAS, the state's adult corrections and juvenile justice
20	facilities have experienced severe overcrowding over the past
20 21	several years; and
	WHEREAS, the parole, probation and early release policies
22	and procedures of the corrections department have an impact on
23	prison discipline, management and overcrowding issues; and
24	WHEREAS, appropriate medical and mental health facilities
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and services are important elements of fiscal planning and population management with respect to both adult and juvenile facilities; and

WHEREAS, the state has embarked on a major program of construction and renovation of adult and juvenile facilities and will need to plan for significant increases in corrections department and children, youth and families department operating budgets; and

WHEREAS, resolution of these issues will require review and analysis of the laws and regulations applicable to, and administered by, the corrections department and the children, youth and families department; and

WHEREAS, oversight of the budgets, policies and procedures of these departments is an element critical in the preparation of appropriate recommendations for legislative, regulatory and administrative improvements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the legislative finance committee be requested to appoint a subcommittee called the joint house and senate subcommittee on prisons; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint house and senate subcommittee on prisons be requested to review all aspects of corrections and children, youth and families department operations, including parole, probation and early release policies; the use of and costs associated with out-of-state

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transfers of adults and juveniles in the justice system, options for renovating existing correctional and detention facilities; and the level of programming provided to adults and juveniles in the state's justice system; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint house and senate subcommittee on prisons be requested to consult with other legislative and executive organizations, including the criminal and juvenile justice coordinating council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint house and senate prison subcommittee be requested to report its findings and recommendations for the consideration of the second session of the forty-third legislature; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the chairman and vice chairman of the legislative finance committee.

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
