A JOINT MEMORIAL

RECOGNIZING THE NEED TO IMPLEMENT THE 1995 REFORMS TO THE NEW MEXICO SUBDIVISION ACT BEFORE MAKING ANY FURTHER REVISIONS TO THAT ACT AND URGING THE NEW MEXICO ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES TO REPORT ITS FINDINGS ABOUT THE REFORMS TO THE FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTY-FOURTH LEGISLATURE ALONG WITH ANY RECOMMENDATIONS.

WHEREAS, the first session of the forty-second legislature, after extensive debate, passed major reforms to the New Mexico Subdivision Act, which included stopping the spread of colonias, closing the four-lot split loophole and providing county commissioners greater authority to regulate subdivisions in their respective communities; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico association of counties organized a task force that drafted model county subdivision regulations to assist counties in the preparation of their own subdivision

ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the 1995 reforms required the Bernalillo, Dona Ana and Santa Fe county commissions to adopt new subdivision ordinances by July 1, 1996 and the remaining thirty counties to adopt new subdivision ordinances by July 1, 1997; and

WHEREAS, Bernalillo, Dona Ana and Santa Fe counties have now adopted new subdivision ordinances, and Mora, San Miguel and Torrance counties have passed new subdivision ordinances ahead of schedule: and

WHEREAS, the experience of the counties that have adopted new ordinances has been extremely positive, but most counties have not had any experience with new subdivision ordinances because the law does not require them to adopt them until July 1, 1997; and

WHEREAS, by January 1999, every county commission will have had at least eighteen months of experience with new subdivision ordinances as part of implementing the 1995 New Mexico Subdivision Act reforms;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that appreciation be expressed to New Mexico's county commissioners and their staffs, to the New Mexico association of counties, to Attorney General Tom Udall and his staff and to the New Mexico homebuilders association for their good work in implementing the 1995 subdivision reforms and encouragement for their future efforts in that endeavor; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature urge the New Mexico association of counties to submit a brief report to the first session of the forty-fourth legislature in January 1999, after informally polling all commissioners, county managers and county attorneys about the 1995 reforms and the new subdivision ordinances and provide any recommended legislative changes to the New Mexico Subdivision Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the meantime the legislature urge the public and other affected parties, such as the New Mexico homebuilders association, to continue to cooperate and assist the county commissioners in successfully implementing new subdivision ordinances in each New Mexico county; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be submitted to Governor Gary Johnson, Lieutenant Governor Walter Bradley, Attorney General Tom Udall, every county commissioner in New Mexico and the New Mexico homebuilders association.
