THE NAVAJO NATION TO WORK TOGETHER TO CONDUCT A MORE EXTENSIVE
REVIEW OF THE NEW MEXICO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES
PLAN TO ADDRESS THE ISSUES AND CONCERNS OF THE NAVAJO NATION.

WHEREAS, access for New Mexicans to services in state agencies is a state priority; and

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation supports the state's temporary assistance for needy families plan that will consolidate the welfare programs in the state and simplify program administration and eligibility requirements for welfare recipients; and

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation has already requested the interested state agencies working on the temporary assistance

for needy families plan to immediately address the concerns and issues of the Navajo Nation in reviewing the state plan; and

WHEREAS, if the Navajo Nation decides to implement its own temporary assistance for needy families plan, pass-through funds and possibly additional state funds will be required to operate the program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department, department of health, labor department and children, youth and families department and the Navajo Nation begin immediately to work together to conduct an extensive review of the New Mexico temporary assistance for needy families plan and address the issues and concerns of the Navajo Nation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the human services department, department of health, labor department and children, youth and families department work with the Navajo Nation to develop, within the provisions of the new welfare reform law, a plan that addresses geographic availability and service area capacity for welfare recipients; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the findings of this joint memorial be presented to the appropriate interim legislative committees by July 1, 1997; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the secretaries of human services, health, labor and children, youth and families and to the president of the
