A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND THE NEW MEXICO OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS WORK IN COOPERATION WITH POTENTIAL LANDMARK SCHOOLS TO STUDY ISSUES INVOLVED IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF LANDMARK SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, it is in New Mexico's best interest to perpetuate its cultural and historic treasures through investment in their preservation and development; and

WHEREAS, one of our most valuable state treasures is the rich cultural background stemming from New Mexico's Indian tribes and pueblos and the interface of Indian people with people of other cultures over the years; and

WHEREAS, one way to recognize and support the ongoing contributions of these treasures to the state is to create "landmark schools"; and

WHEREAS, the legislature proposes to authorize the creation of "landmark schools" as evidence of their significant cultural and historical contributions to the state; and

WHEREAS, landmark schools could develop enrichment programs, including leadership development programs, to help produce future tribal and state leadership and to assure quality interaction between state and tribal officials to address and resolve issues of mutual concern; and

WHEREAS, landmark school programs could include community-based programs defining issues essential to the quality of life on Indian reservations and pueblos, incorporating these issues into science, math and technology curricula and further developing native arts programs to teach both traditional and contemporary art, thus assuring the continued development of talented artists who can contribute to New Mexico's art-based culture; and

WHEREAS, landmark schools could also provide language instructional programs recognizing that native language is essential to tribal, cultural and religious traditions; and

WHEREAS, landmark schools would support and enhance the intergovernmental relationship between the state and tribal governments, but implementation of landmark schools requires that certain issues be identified and studied; and

WHEREAS, some of these issues include state and federal funding issues; issues involving the relationships between a

landmark school and the local school district in which it is located, the state board of education and local school districts from which the resident students come; issues involving academic standards to be maintained; and issues involving the governing structure of a landmark school;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that it request the state department of public education, the attorney general and the New Mexico office of Indian affairs, in cooperation with any potential landmark school, to work together to study the identified issues and any other issues involved in the establishment of a landmark school; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these entities report to the legislative education study committee and any other appropriate interim committee on their recommendations regarding landmark schools before the second session of the forty-third legislature; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the director of the legislative education study committee staff, the superintendent of public instruction, the attorney general and the director of the New Mexico office of Indian affairs.
