### A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE MOTOR VEHICLE DIVISION STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF REINSTITUTION OF THE CONSULAR LICENSE PLATES.

WHEREAS, Laws 1993, Chapter 180, Section 1 deleted former Paragraph (5) of Subsection A of Section 66-3-406 NMSA 1978, which provided for special motor vehicle registration plates for the consular corps in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the consular corps is composed of honored guests of the state who are instrumental in assisting the state's economic development; and

WHEREAS, the north American free trade agreement, industrial development along the border with Mexico and expanding trade with the Pacific rim will lead to expansion of the state's consular presence and importance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE

STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the motor vehicle division of the taxation and revenue department be requested to study the feasibility of reinstituting the consular special motor vehicle registration plate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the motor vehicle division report on its findings and recommendations to the appropriate committee of the legislature by December 1, 1997; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of taxation and revenue and to the director of the motor vehicle division.
