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#### SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL 55

# 43RD LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 1997

#### INTRODUCED BY

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## A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH A DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TASK FORCE TO PRODUCE RECOMMENDATIONS TO DEAL WITH THE ALARMING INCREASE OF VIOLENCE OCCURRING WITHIN THE HOMES OF NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, there was a thirty-six percent increase in nights of institutional shelter provided to the women and children of New Mexico necessitated by domestic violence in the past two years; and

WHEREAS, nonresident, or "out-patient", services to the same category of family members increased over twenty-nine percent for the same reasons in the same time frame; and

WHEREAS, the total clients served in that two-year period increased nearly eighteen percent to a total of twenty-six thousand five hundred separate clients served in fiscal year

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WHEREAS, no appropriation increase has been sought by the administration for this serious and growing problem since fiscal year 1995; and

WHEREAS, the federal commitment this year is to double New Mexico's share to four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000); and

WHEREAS, recent state cutbacks and other budgetary changes produced an average ten percent reduction in funding for domestic violence centers, resulting in closing some satellite centers: and

WHEREAS, two thousand five hundred families will be deprived of domestic violence services if the threatened sixteen percent expenditure reduction is executed; and

WHEREAS, the current request for proposal process used to allocate funds is counter productive, draining resources needed to provide services while simultaneously preventing or inhibiting healthy agency planning;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health establish and provide staff support, with the cooperation of the children, youth and families department, to a task force on domestic violence for the purpose of developing an efficient base funding formula for allocation of funding for domestic violence programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force include a

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representative of the office of the attorney general, the children, youth and families department, the public health division of the department of health, the substance abuse division of the department of health, the maternal and child health bureau of the department of health, the advanced training bureau of the department of public safety and the crime victims reparation commission; representation from any other state agencies with responsibilities related to domestic violence issues; and representation from each domestic violence service center in the state; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force elect a chairman from among its membership; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force make a preliminary report to both the interim legislative health and human services and legislative finance committees at their October 1997 meetings and a final report with legislative recommendations at the committees' respective meetings in October 1998; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent to all affected agencies and organizations.

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
