WHEREAS, pursuant to the Executive Reorganization Act all cabinet secretaries in New Mexico are appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate, serve in the executive cabinet and hold office at the pleasure of the governor; and

WHEREAS, there are no mi nimum requirements or standards in place in New Mexico regarding cabinet positions, with the exception of the secretary of finance and administration position, with the only requirement in stat ute being that "The secretary shall be well versed in governmental finance"; and WHEREAS, the governor appoints and the senate consents in
