15	WHEREAS, pursuant to the Executive Reorganization Act all
16	cabinet secretaries in New Mexico are appointed by the governor
17	with the advice and consent of the senate, serve in the
18	executive cabinet and hold office at the pleasure of the
19	governor; and
20	WHEREAS, there are no minimum requirements or standards in
21	place in New Mexico regarding cabinet positions, with the
22	exception of the secretary of finance and administration
23	position, with the only requirement in statute being that "The
24	secretary shall be well versed in governmental finance"; and
25	WHEREAS, the governor appoints and the senate consents in

our system of checks and balances, but as we just witnessed with the senate declining the appointment of corrections secretarydesignate Dona Wilpolt, decisions to reject an appointee can certainly be based on directly related job experience and expertise;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the legislative council service be asked to conduct a study of other states' criteria in selecting candidates for cabinet-level positions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the director of the legislative council service and the New Mexico legislative council.
