WHEREAS, New Mexico's major political parties are in an excellent position to create an independent process to oversee and voluntarily regulate campaign practices of the parties and party candidates; and

WHEREAS, such a review process could involve a mechanism
made up of representatives from the major political parties; and
WHEREAS, such a review process should result in a code of
conduct to outline acceptable standards of fairness, honesty and
responsibility for candidates; and

WHEREAS, all political parties and their candidates should be requested and encouraged to sign and adhere to such a campaign practices code of conduct; and

WHEREAS, the major political parties should encourage voluntary compliance with the provisions of a code of conduct by withholding party funding if it is determined, by a jointly established review mechanism, that the letter or the spirit of a provision of the code was violated; and

WHEREAS, an established mechanism could also operate as a filter to review and reduce negative, misleading or unethical campaign advertising by reviewing campaign literature or advertisements submitted voluntarily by candidates or organizations, especially those distributed during the last two weeks of a campaign, prior to their release to the public;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE

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STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the major political parties in New Mexico be requested and strongly urged to review options, including the possible establishment of an independent campaign practices commission, to voluntarily regulate campaign practices, literature and advertisements in New Mexico political campaigns; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the major political parties or a joint campaign practices commission or other oversight body should develop and disseminate a code of conduct for New Mexico political candidates, and request that each major political party and political candidate sign and abide by that code of conduct; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the major political parties or any joint campaign practices commission or other oversight body that is created should hold frequent meetings during political campaigns to review the campaign practices of candidates who have signed a code of conduct; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the major political parties consider among the incentives they create for adhering to a campaign practices code of conduct the withdrawal of party funding for candidates who violate the code; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent to the chairpersons of each of New Mexico's major political parties.
